PWP

- IS another intervention in PSSN programme
- It involves working 4 hours a day for an entitlement of 2300/ per day to a benefitting Households
- Subproject identification is done by the whole community during village assembly
- CMC and PAA facilitator do manage the process

PWP

 Its is voluntary to participate and payment will be made to only who participated for 15 days a month for 4 months hence 60 days

Priority areas for PWP subprojects

All PWP subprojects shall be fall on the following categories

- Water terraces
- Tree planting
- Grazing for cattles
- Soil conservation
- Irrigations schemes
- Rain water harvestings

Priority areas

- Community roads
- Sewage cleaning, garbage collections
- Agroforestry

Challenges

- Reviewing of subprojects to match with government directives and plans
- Identified subprojects were not were not sustainable after 60 days of implementations such as in Singida Municipal
- In Mkalama PAA, there were a gap between sector expert and coordination.

Challenges

- Shortage of facilitation and monitoring funds to PAA and Regional secretariat
- Climatic conditions and Weather of our region doesn't support growth of tress after projects completions
- Reluctances of community participations
